Since West Jordan became a town in 1941 much has changed. At the time, there were about 1,800 residents, and the city was largely a rural community of about 4,000 people until 1970. Building boomed from 1973 to 1979 when the city's population exploded 500 percent to 27,329 and growth has continued ever since. The city officially passed the 100,000 population milestone in 2007, making West Jordan a "first class" city according to state statute. With more than one-third of the city's land still undeveloped, continued growth is expected.

Hard dirt also poses a safety risk to animals and riders alike and cowboys don't like to land on it. Ouch! The dirt should be light and fluffy, but not too light that it kicks up too much dust.

CERVI CHAMPIONSHIP RODEO



CERVI CHAMPIONSHIP RODEO IS CELE-BRATING 50 YEARS OF RODEO THIS YEAR!

It all began in 1967 when the Cervi family purchased the renowned Beutler Brothers Rodeo Company. Then in 1974, they also acquired the Billy Minick Rodeo Company, which was formerly owned by well-known producers Harry Knight and Gene Autry. These two companies were the two largest companies in the rodeo business. With the acquisition, Cervi became the largest stock contractor in the nation and renamed the company Cervi Championship Rodeo.

FOUNDER MIKE CERVI began his rodeo career at age 14, traveling across North America from the great plains of Texas to the rolling hills of Grand Prairie Alberta, Canada working as a rodeo clown. Mike's two sons Binion and Chase run the company today.

and heads up the production side, oversees the breeding program for the bucking horses, manages the finances and public relations. Having experienced the "show business" part of rodeo through his trick-riding acts, Binion uses these skills to create audience appealing openings, closings and specialty acts that illustrate American patriotism and western heritage.

CHASE CERVI serves as the ranch manager and pick-up man. He is also very involved in the behind-the-scenes organization of the company and organizes the breeding program for the company's bucking bulls, oversees the management of staff who work each rodeo, and is a true stockman helping to tend to

In the past seven years, 98 Cervi Championship Rodeo animals have been selected for the NFR, and they were honored to win three go rounds at the 2016 NFR.
