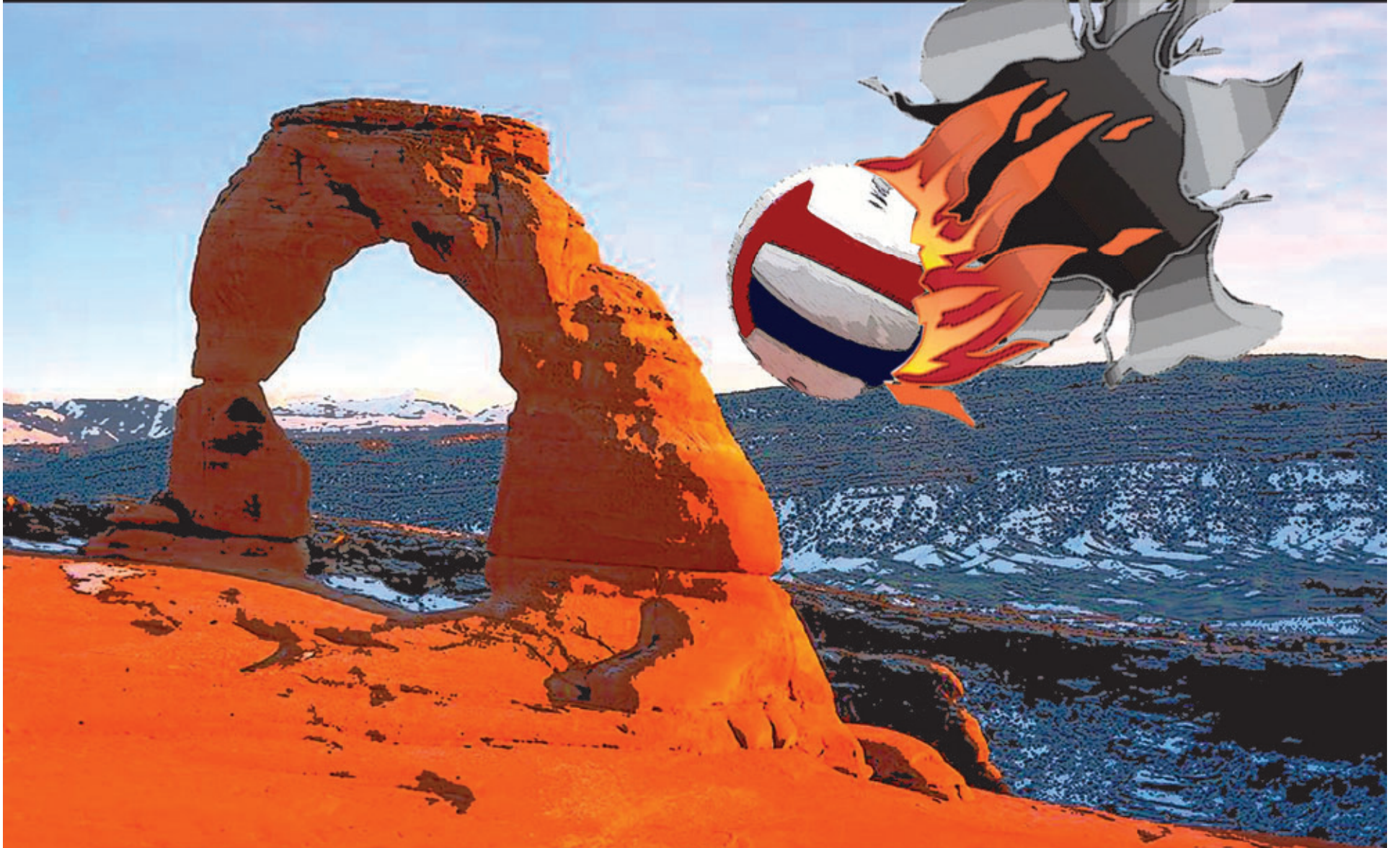

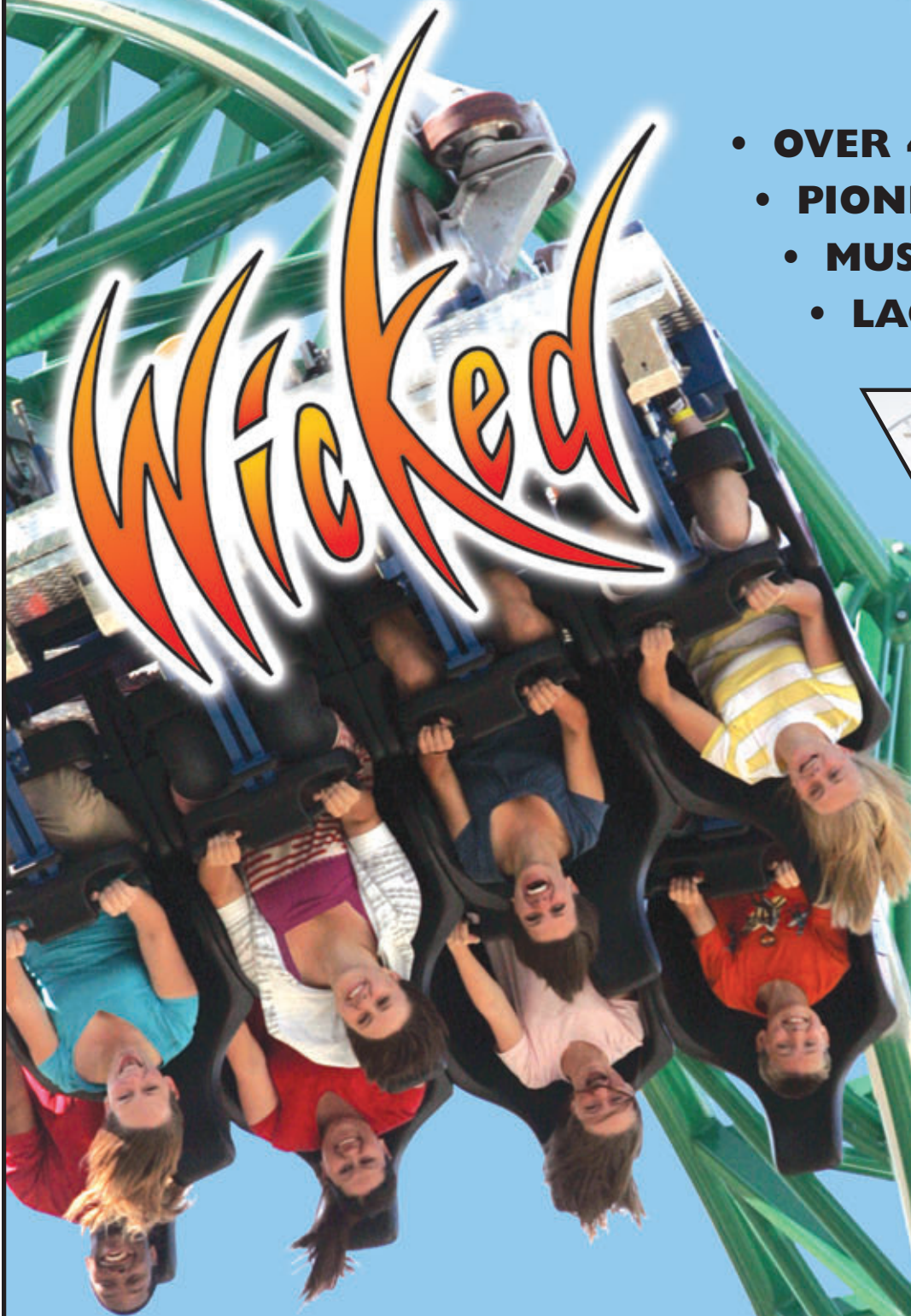

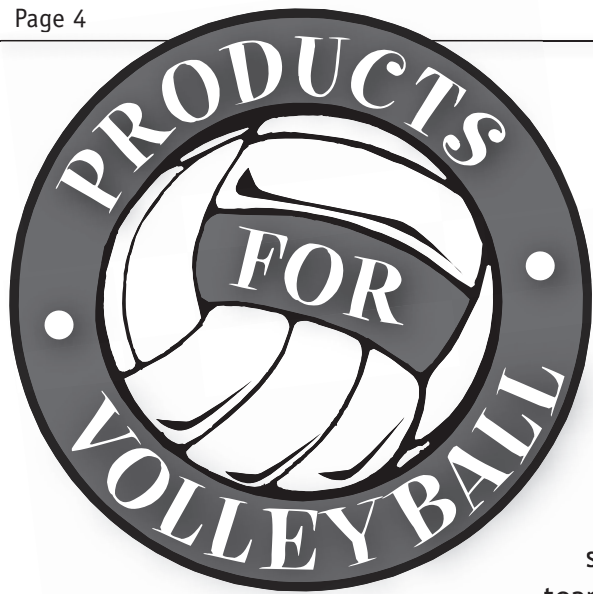

## Kim Norman: Dedicated to the Dream

Kim Norman lives and breathes volleyball. It's been that way since an early age.

Her year revolves around the sport. Part of the year, she coaches the Westminster College Griffin team, which has been very successful. When that season ends, it's a quick transition to her duties as President of Intermountain Volleyball Association (AVA), which she founded.

During her career she has done some remarkable things—won many championships, developed organized volleyball in the Intermountain West, coached and developed numerous collegiate and Olympic athletes—Logan Tom, to name just one. But her greatest accomplishment may be yet to come.

At a time when most people could sit back and admire what they have accomplished, Kim realized there was more that can be done to help make the world a better place and further develop volleyball. "I want kids to know how amazing they are, and that they can change the world. Through the sport of volleyball, we teach principles of volleyball and life at a very young age," says Norman. "Most players start late—in their early teens, if at all. Up to that age, most athletes are limited to the team sports available to them. Typically, volleyball is not one of those sports, especially for boys."

Kim realized that most volleyball organizations are not focusing their efforts on teaching and growing volleyball players at an early age. This realization set Kim in motion to develop the AVA, an association dedicated to promoting health and wellness through the

### An Historical Profile

# Intermountain Volleyball Association

The Intermountain Volleyball Association (IVA) was first incorporated by George Miles of Kaysville, Utah, with a very small Junior Olympic Volleyball program in the late 1980's. The IVA was run by Harold Buckner until its incorporation status expired with the State of Utah in 1990.

In early 1991, Kimberly Norman, Stuart Sherman, and Chris Blackhurst reincorporated the IVA with the State of Utah and formed its first board of directors. During the first IVA Board of Directors meeting after reincorporating, under the direction of Kimberly Norman, the now-successful Junior Olympic Volleyball

Program was launched.

The first year proved successful with a significant increase of 500% in IVA membership. The Ju-



nior Olympic Volleyball membership increased from 25 members to 660 members during that same year.

Since that time, there has been a large increase in Junior Olympic Volleyball membership every year. IVA continues to grow with the main theme, "What is good for Volleyball!"

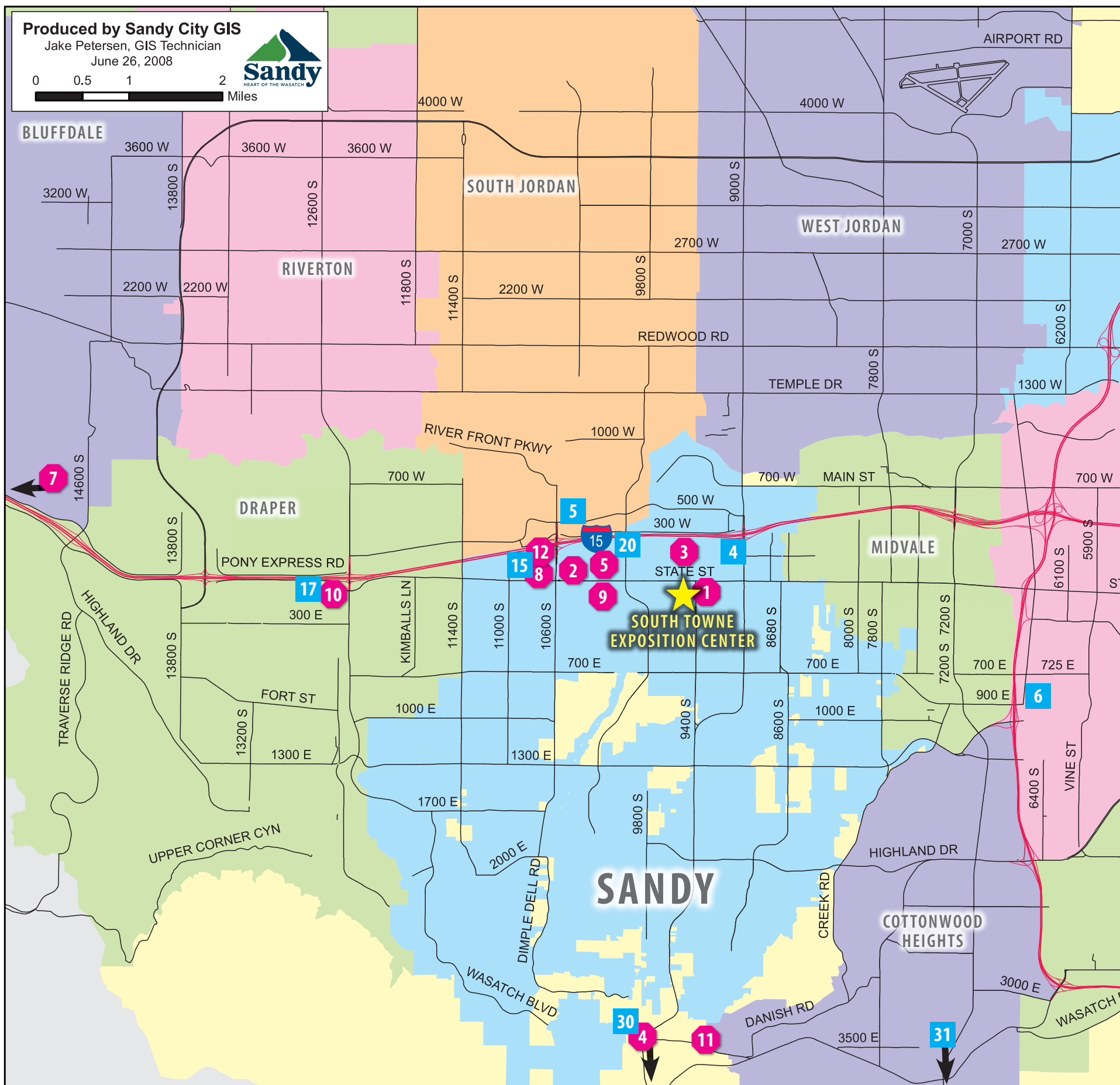

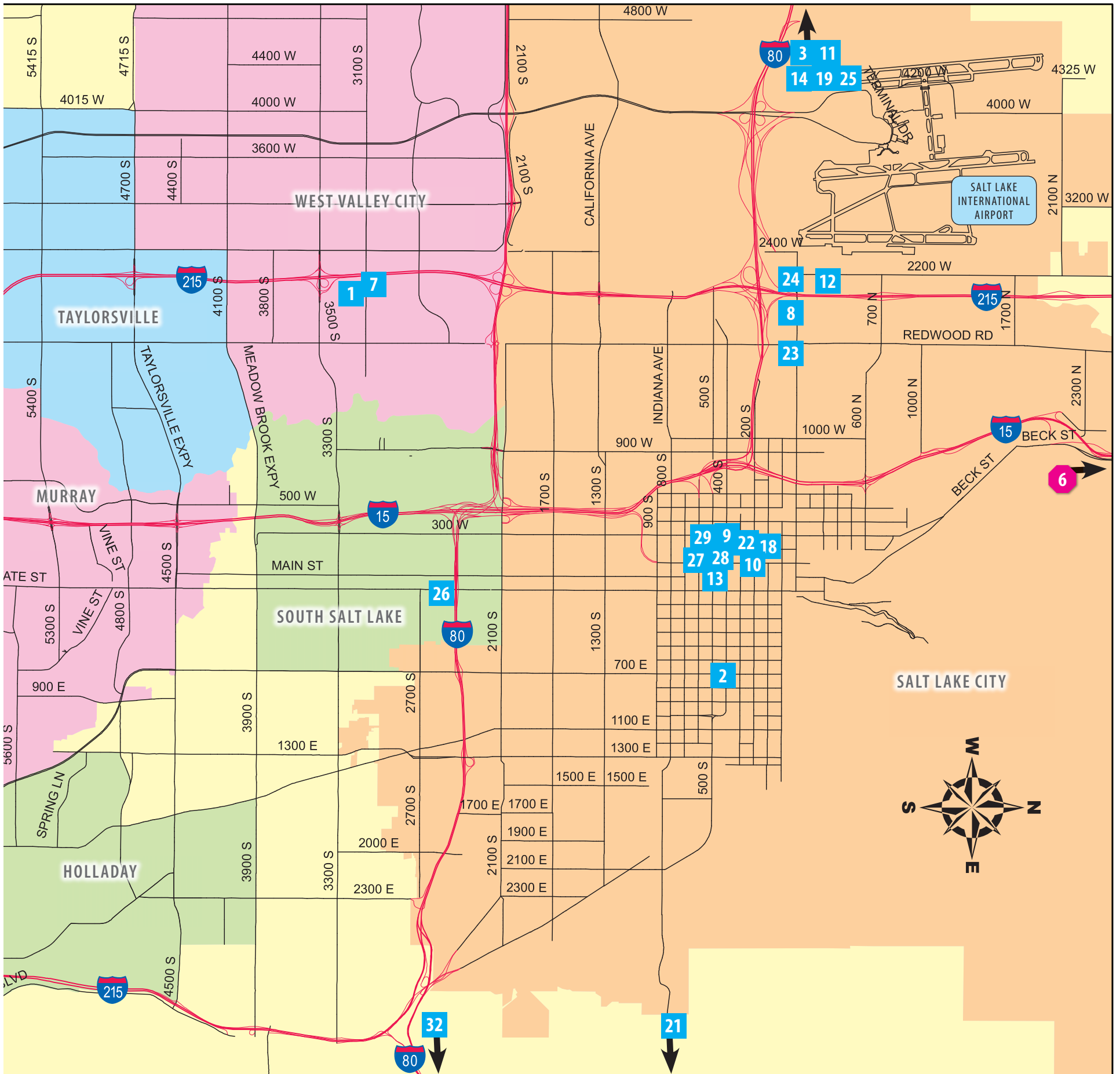

Utah boasts a barrage of opportunities to celebrate Independence Day. Nearly every city in the valley will have activities and celebrations throughout July 4th. ### CELEBRATIONS

Throughout the area, there are many activities in which you can participate. A great way to enjoy the 4th of July is to visit Lagoon—an amusement park just 17 miles North of Downtown Salt Lake with great rides, a water park and a fireworks show at dusk.

Snowbird Ski and Summer Resort offers several dining options and activities, including an Alpine Slide, Zip Rider, climbing wall and Aerial Tram. (See ad on page 4 for a discount coupon.)

For those looking for a more distinctive way to celebrate the fourth of July, try La Caille, a fine dining restaurant in the mouth of Little Cottonwood Canyon—just east of the Sandy Expo Center. La Caille offers its guests a trip back in time to 18th century rural France. Dinner and a walk through the estate at La Caille with fireworks in the air will leave a long lasting impression of the hidden beauties that Utah has to offer.

### FIREWORKS

Several cities in the Salt Lake Valley host their own professional firework show at dusk. With the unique setting of the Salt Lake Valley, it's possible to find a vantage point offering a view of several fireworks shows at once. There are some areas along the Wasatch Mountain foothills (Eastern side of the valley) that will allow for this view; the Oquirrh Mountains to the West also have a few areas with a good view.

Fireworks are available for sale in nearly all grocery stores as well as street-side fireworks stands throughout the valley. You are permitted to light fireworks purchased locally around the fourth of July in most cities, however many of the larger more dangerous fireworks are prohibited due to fire hazards. The lighting of fireworks is prohibited in Utah State Parks, National Parks and Forests, also in most canyon areas. Keep in mind that Utah is a desert state and July brings very hot, dry conditions. So please be responsible and use care while lighting fireworks and, of course, have a fun and safe 4th of July in Utah.

# USAV brings the nation together

USA Volleyball (USAV) ranks as one of the leading amateur sports bodies in the nation. Aggressive in the pursuit of providing innovative programming and improved benefits for its athletes, USAV is dedicated to bringing world excellence in volleyball to America.

The USAV is the nation’s volleyball leader. The United States Olympic Committee recognizes it as the National governing body for the sport. It is the exclusive representative of the nation to the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB) and to a number of other international sport bodies.

The story of the USAV cannot be told without first looking at the history of the sport itself. Volleyball was created in Holyoke, Massachusetts, by William G. Morgan, a YMCA physical education director, in 1895. It became popular immediately and by 1900 the rules had evolved to require its own special ball. The movement took the sport around the world, and in 1913 it was included in the Far East Games in Manila.

The USAV was founded in 1928 at the Yale Club in New York City, for the purpose of representing the sport nationally and internationally, and for conducting an annual national open championship. It has fulfilled this purpose ever since and today includes among its member organizations the National Collegiate Athletic Association, the YMCA, the National Federation of State High School Associations, the National Park and Recreation Association, and other groups.

The USAV has divided the nation into 39 regions. Within each region there are a number of programs conducted, including regular competitions organized by age and/or ability, summer instructional camps and clinics for the development of coaches, players and referees. International competitions involving the USA National Team and foreign opponents are also regular features in many of these regions.

development of volleyball at the grassroots level for kids of all ages. AVA is more than just a name or a program. It’s a way to help kids discover how amazing they are, learn healthy habits and enjoy the game of volleyball. AVA also allows those involved to make a living doing something they enjoy—being involved with people and the game of volleyball.

Kim set out to make AVA something different from other kids’ athletic programs. She spent considerable time creating specific volleyball programs for kids to learn the game and help them discover how to be a better person. At the same time, the programs are designed to be transferable from coach to coach.

After designing the programs on paper, she tested them to make sure they accomplished what she envisioned. For example, AVA developed Volley Starzz—a program for kids five to seven years.

AVA discovered that kids liked the program—they really liked it. They begged to play more and they got hooked on the game. More importantly, it set a foundation for learning healthy skills for a lifetime.

AVA then tested to see if other people coaching different kids would have similar results. It was

a success! The same thing happened—young kids, boys and girls all got hooked on playing. “It didn’t matter which age group we worked with, or who was teaching, the results were the same: kids became excited about playing volleyball.” said Norman. “Our goal for AVA now is to take the programs we’ve developed and expand them across the country. We know we’re developing something good with AVA, and we want other people to share in what we’re developing. The beauty of the AVA is people can get involved doing something that helps other people, in a game they love, and be compensated for their time.”
