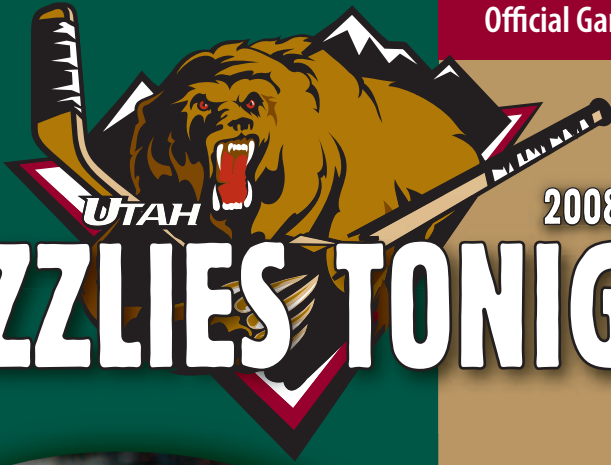
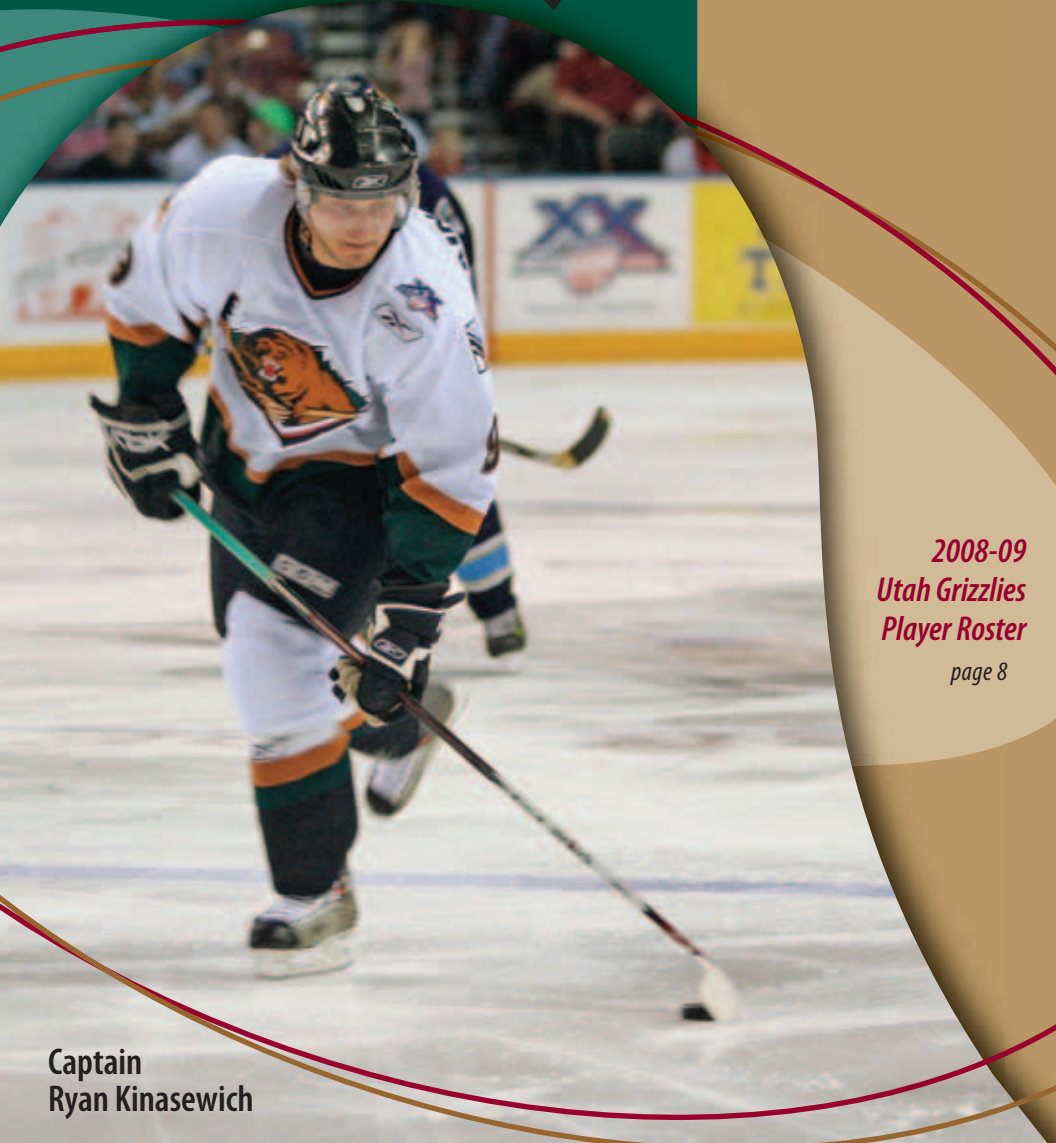

# Colley

## hopes to be an inspiration

**K**evin Colley played in sixteen NHL games, before suffering a career-ending injury. Now, less than three years later, Colley is making his pro coaching debut.

Less than three years after having his playing career taken away from him, Kevin Colley is now a professional head coach.

The 29-year-old was tabbed as coach of the Utah Grizzlies last Thursday, just days after Jason Christie left the club to become the assistant coach of the Chicago Wolves in the American Hockey League. Colley was Christie's assistant in 2007-08.

It's quite the step up for Colley, who helped Christie lead the Grizzlies to the National Conference Finals less than six months ago. It's a step that Colley says he's ready to take.

"I'm always confident in myself and I've always played for good coaches," Colley told NHL.com. "Obviously, you might have some jitters of being a first-year coach, but I'm confident in what I have to get done with the young athletes that are coming in."

Without question, the young athlete Colley is referring to will be inspired by what the New Haven, Conn., native was able to accomplish as a player. An undrafted forward who scored 85 goals in three seasons with the Oshawa Generals in the Ontario Hockey League, Colley first arrived on the ECHL scene with the Dayton Bombers in 1999.

It took four years before he received his first

full-time job in the American Hockey League. In 2003-04, Colley went 12-19-31 with 122 penalty minutes in 78 games for the Bridgeport Sound Tigers. He spent two full seasons there and started a third campaign in Bridgeport before being called up by the New York Islanders – who are Utah's NHL affiliate.

"It was gratifying to know how much these guys looked up to me and respected what I did," Colley said of being an assistant coach with the Grizzlies last season. "Some guys get to this level and they're down on themselves and kind of blame other people. I'm here to kind of be an inspiration. If you dedicate yourselves to hockey, good things will happen. There is light at the end of the tunnel."

Colley's light burned out long before it should have. Sixteen games into his NHL career, it was all over. During a game against the Washington Capitals on Jan. 31, 2006, he fractured his fifth cervical vertebrae. He underwent surgery and was forced to retire.

It was a painful and unfair way for Colley's career to end, given the amount of work he put in to reach the NHL. Coaching, however, has been a way for him to remain close to the game. The plan now is to work his way back up behind the bench.

"Last year was a little tough, and I just want-

ed to go out and help the guys,” Colley said. “But I’ve let go of my injury. There’s no anger. This is what I’m supposed to do. Obviously, my injury was unfortunate, but I also think that everything happens for a reason. I’m just looking forward to getting my own identity as a coach now.”

After hearing the news that he got the job, Colley immediately spoke with Chicago Blackhawks assistant coach Mike Haviland. Much like Colley, Haviland spent years behind minor-league benches and worked his way up to the NHL this summer. Haviland coached Colley and the Atlantic City Boardwalk Bullies to a Kelly Cup championship in 2003.

“It was great to hear from him,” Colley said. “He’s probably the biggest influence that I’ve had. Just listening to Havie and how proud I am that he’s up in Chicago . . . he put in a lot of long days and hard work to achieve getting to the NHL. I have full confidence in him that he will be a head coach in the NHL soon.”

Haviland also started his professional career in the ECHL, as an assistant coach with the Trenton Titans in 1999. Just like the players, the ECHL is an avenue for coaches to prove themselves and work their way up to the professional ranks.

There’s no better league to start in than the ECHL. It’s all about giving young players and young coaches an opportunity and seeing what you can make out of it. “There’s no better league to start in



than the ECHL,” said Colley, who named retired Grizzlies defenseman Jeff Dwyer assistant coach on Wednesday. “It’s all about giving young players and young coaches an opportunity and seeing what you can make out of it.”

Christie is convinced that Colley is the right man for the job in Utah. In fact, he recommended his former assistant to Grizzlies’ brass before exiting for Chicago.

“I thought it was the right fit,” Christie said. “I think what he brings to

the table is why you play the game. He went from the ECHL to the NHL. Obviously, his injury was a tough one. But now he can just focus on what he knows about the game into a coaching way.”

With his roster basically set – the Grizzlies are set to receive a handful of players from the Isles – Colley is anxious to get things going. While he knows he has something to prove to people such as Islanders GM Garth Snow and Sound Tigers president Howard Saffan, Colley is confident that the best is still yet to come.

“I’m real excited . . . Christmas kind of came early for me,” Colley said. “I’m just going to do everything in my power to succeed. This is the avenue, to be a coach now. I’ve got my chance and I’m going to make the most out of it.”

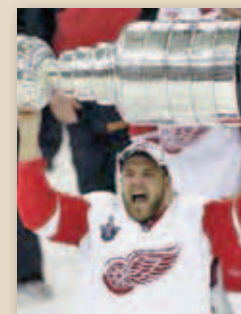
### ECHL Celebrates 21st Season

The ECHL will celebrate its 21st season in 2008-09 with 23 teams in 16 states and British Columbia including the Ontario Reign who will play in the new state-of-the-art Citizens Business Bank Arena, a \$130 million multi-purpose facility in Ontario, Calif. The only professional leagues that have played longer are the National Hockey League and the American Hockey League.



### ECHL Premier 'AA' Hockey League

The ECHL has affiliations with 26 of the 30 teams in the National Hockey League, marking the 12th consecutive season that the league has had affiliations with at least 20 teams. The league continues to shine as the Premier 'AA' Hockey League as 355 players have played in the NHL after the ECHL including 210 who have made their debut in the last seven seasons.



### Giving Back to the Community

In addition to providing affordable family entertainment, ECHL teams donated \$3.9 million, including \$1.2 million in monetary contributions, to charitable and non-profit organizations in 2007-08. The league and its teams have donated more than \$6.7 million in the last two years and nearly \$9 million in the last three seasons.

### Royals Host All-Star Competition

The 2009 ECHL All-Star Game and Skills Competition will be hosted on Jan. 20-21 in Reading, Pa. by the Reading Royals, the City of Reading and the Sovereign Center. Representatives from the National Hockey League and the American Hockey League travel to the ECHL All-Star Game every year to watch the top young players in the Premier 'AA' Hockey League. The game has produced 42 players who have gone on to play in the NHL including 26 since 2002 when the format was changed to feature younger prospects.



### Hall of Fame Recognitions

The ECHL Hall of Fame was introduced in 2007-08 and the inaugural class of Henry Brabham, Patrick J. Kelly, Chris Valicevic and Nick Vitucci were inducted as part of the activities at the All-Star Game in Stockton, Calif. Members of the ECHL Hall of Fame are recognized at the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto, Ontario as well as online at [ECHLHallOfFame.com](http://ECHLHallOfFame.com).



### Kelly Cup Goes to Cincinnati

Cincinnati won the Kelly Cup at home in front of the largest crowd in ECHL postseason history with 12,722 fans in the 12,056-seat U.S. Bank Arena. The Cyclones became the third team in league history to win both the regular season and postseason championships while bringing Cincinnati its first professional championship since the Reds won the World Series in 1990.



### Recognizing the Coaches

Bruce Boudreau, who coached Mississippi for three seasons winning the Kelly Cup championship in 1999, was named NHL Coach of the Year in 2007-08 becoming the first former ECHL coach to receive the award. Calgary Flames associate coach Jim Playfair, Chicago Blackhawks assistant coach Mike Haviland, Anaheim Ducks assistant coach Dave Farrish and Carolina Hurricanes head coach Peter Laviolette are all former ECHL coaches. Scott Gordon, who was a player and coach in the ECHL, is in his first season as head coach of the New York Islanders.



### Officials Move Up

Eighteen former ECHL officials were part of the National Hockey League officiating team in 2007-08 including Dan O'Rourke. Four former ECHL referees and three former ECHL linesmen worked in the 2008 Stanley Cup Playoffs including Tim Nowak, who in 2003 became the first ECHL official to work in the Stanley Cup Finals.



### Fans Love ECHL Hockey

For the fifth straight year and the 11th time in the last 12 years, the ECHL had more than four million fans attend its games in 2007-08. The Kelly Cup Playoffs in 2008 drew 331,798 fans, the largest postseason attendance in the 20-year history of the league. Eleven ECHL teams raised their attendance in 2007-08 and the league had 51 sellouts, the most capacity crowds in the last five years and the fourth time in the last five seasons that the league has had at least 40 sellouts.

### Former ECHL Players/Coaches Rewarded

Former ECHL player Andrew Hutchinson was the defenseman of the year in the American Hockey League in 2007-08. In the last three seasons there have been more than 225 players who have played in both the ECHL and the AHL. There are nine head coaches and 16 assistant coaches in the AHL who are former ECHL coaches and the AHL Coach of the Year award has been won by a former ECHL coach each of the last three seasons and seven times in the last eight years.
